




RANMORE COMMON


We call this the Castle Tree because you can sit in it and defend yourself from enemy pine cone attacks. There is also another large tree closer to the NT car park.

This fallen tree makes a great natural climbing frame.




LEITH HILL

Too hard to climb but great for swinging from.





This tree has long tentacles.






17 ST MARTHA'S HILL

Hard to climb but a great area for frolicking.






5 BETCHWORTH PARK







This tree is gnarly. There are other good trees nearby.




16 THE NOWER





The Nower is a great place to explore. Visit the temple at the top of the hill.




15 MICKLEHAM DOWNS


HEADLEY HEATH

One of many good climbing trees near the Headley Heath car park.




REYNARDS HILL


DRUIDS GROVE





Lots of good Yew trees to explore in this area.






13 PITCH HILL





Big pine trees and a clearing for playing games.




NETLEY HEATH

This tree is close to the car park (and cafe!) at Newlands Corner.






FRIDAY STREET


This tree is close to the Broadmoor car park but is quite hard to find. Make sure you visit the hammer pond nearby.
