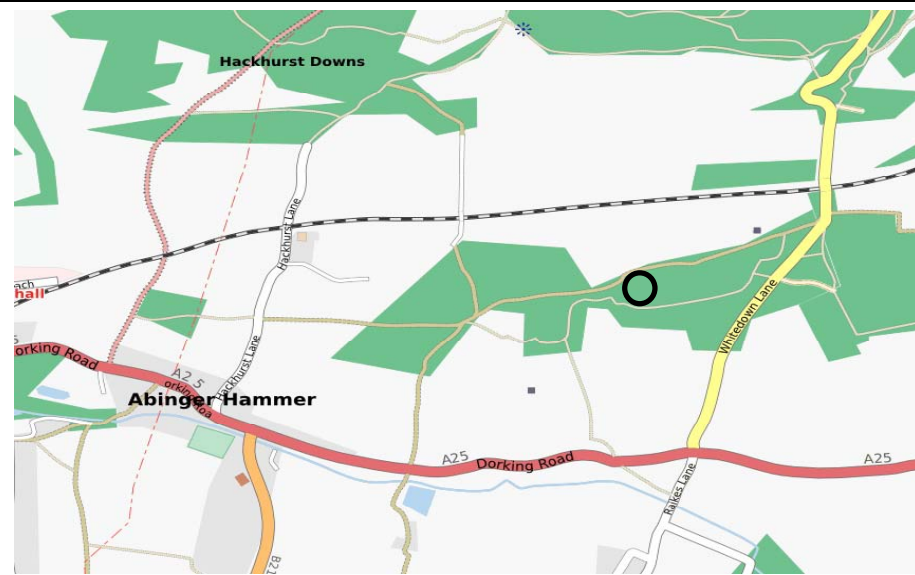

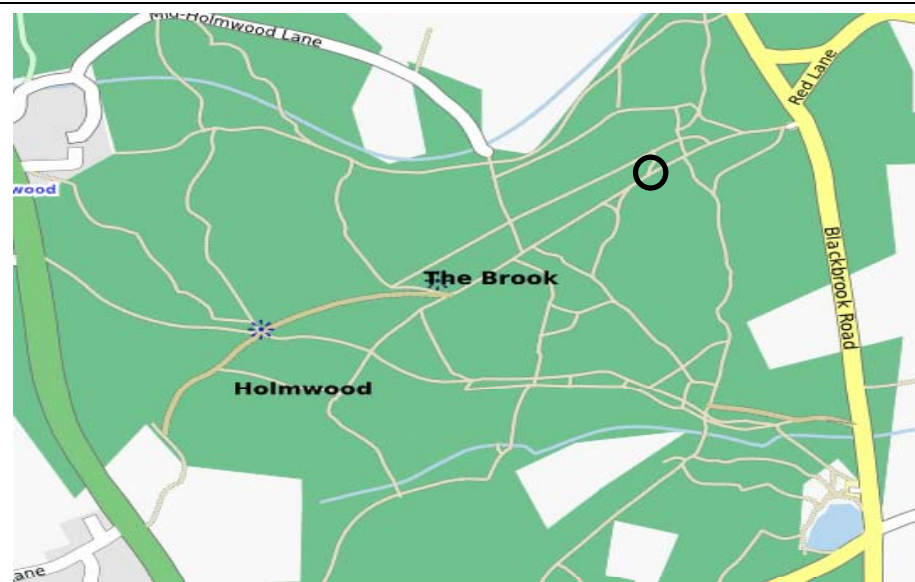

This fallen tree makes a great natural climbing frame.

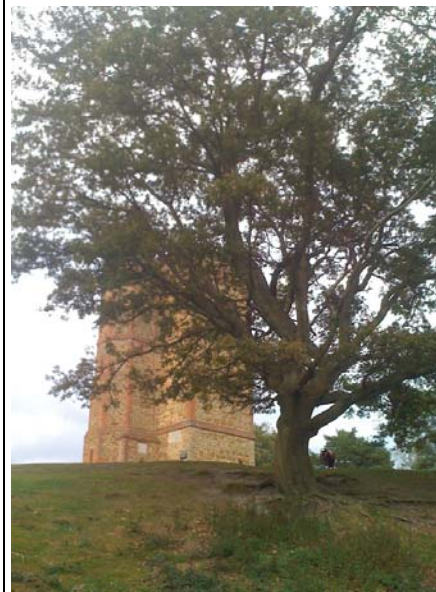

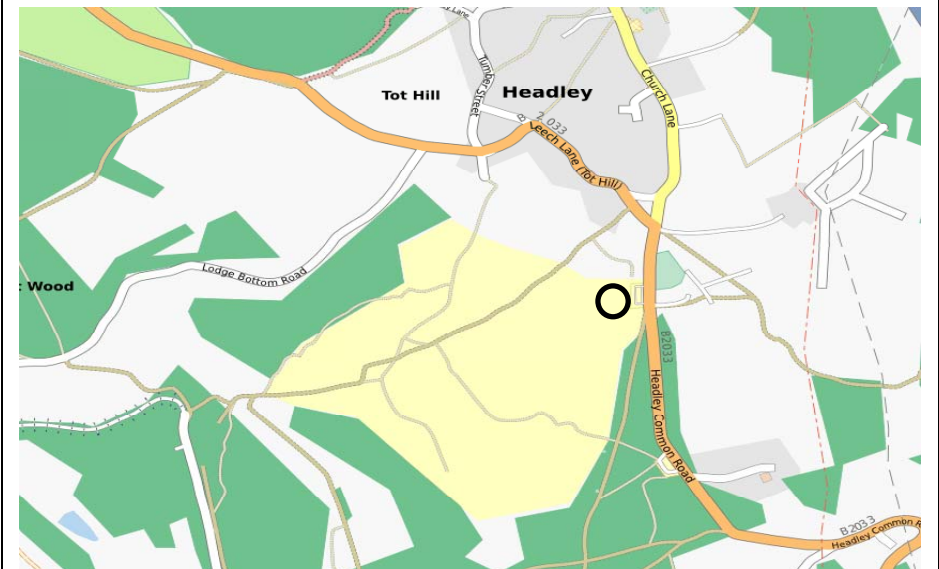

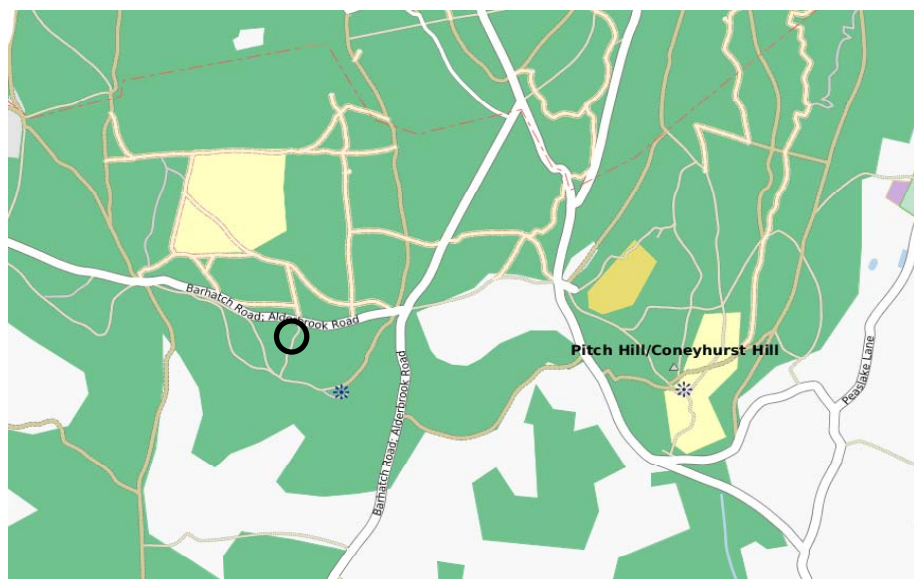

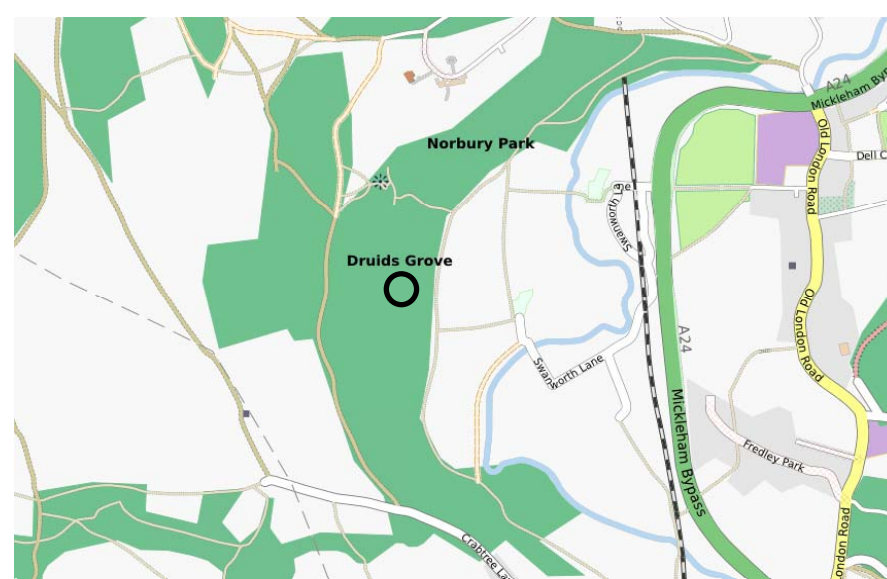

Sheeples has a number of wooded areas with meadows (or 'Leas') inbetween.

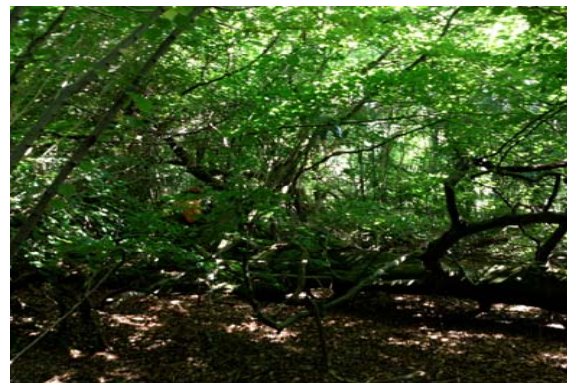

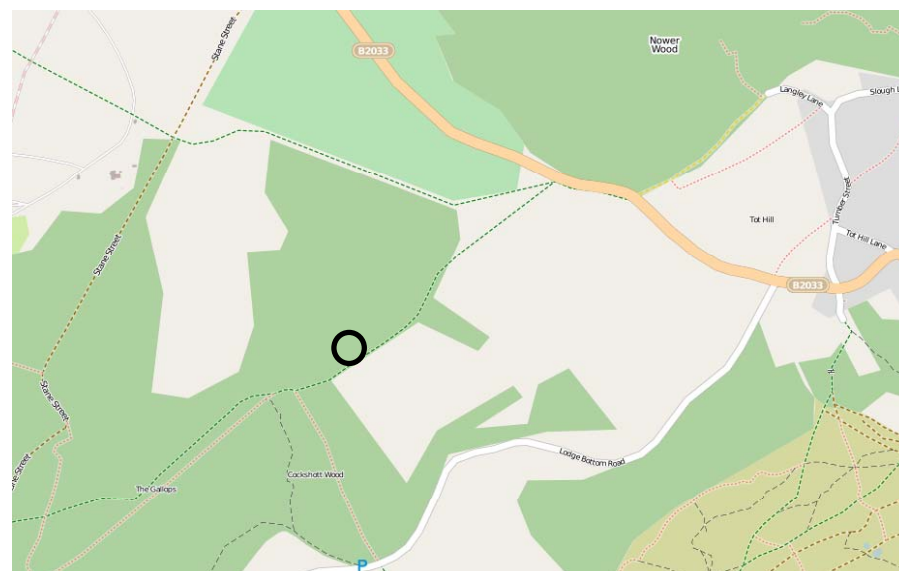
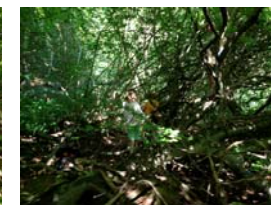
